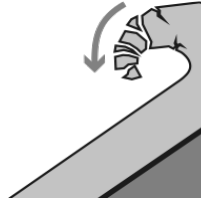

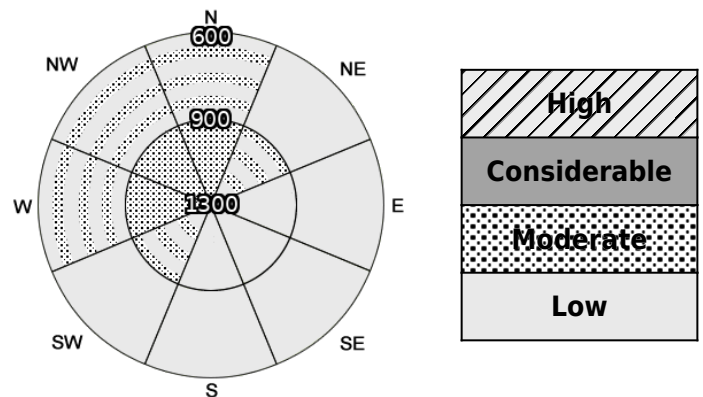

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will develop on Westerly to Northerly aspects mainly above 900 metres with cross loading onto other aspects. Areas most affected will be around coire rims, gully tops and crag aprons. Some instabilities will persist at depth on these aspects above 1000 metres, but these will be confined to only very steep places around core rims, convex shaped terrain, gully exits and where the old firm windslab becomes shallow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong to gale force South-East winds with snow showers throughout the forecast period. The freezing level will steadily fall to around 700 metres by the end of the day.
