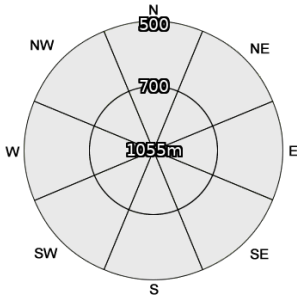


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Sun 18/03/2018 TO 18:00HRS Mon 19/03/2018



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

No precipitation is forecast. Strong East winds will ease and back East-North-East becoming moderate North-North-East by the end of the period. The freezing level will stay low rising to around 450 metres tomorrow afternoon.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snow pack which is mainly above 650 metres will remain firm and generally stable on all aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

Observed Weather Influences

It has been a cold day with strong Easterly winds, there were some very light snow flurries leaving just a trace of snow on the summits.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snow pack has remained firm and generally stable on all aspects. The avalanche hazard is Low.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions

Firm snow - ice on most aspects above 650 metres. Clear in the morning with some variable visibility on some higher summits later . Winds 25-35 mph feeling very cold.

Comments

Another fine day with firm snow, it felt very cold on wind exposed aspects.
