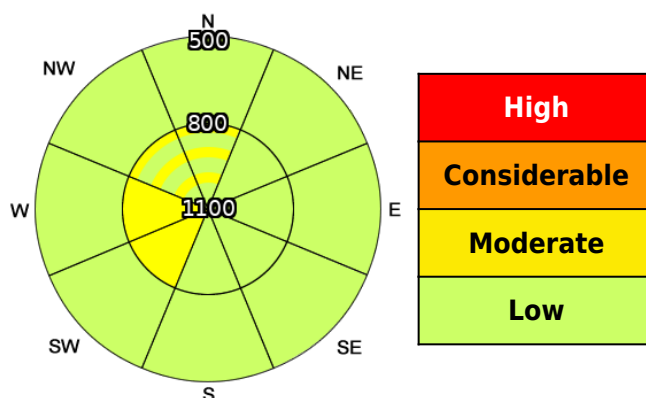
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some re-distribution of most recent light deposits will occur, with modest accumulations of localised windslab developing on mainly South-Westerly to Westerly aspects above 800 metres. Some localised cross-loading is also possible in very steep sided gully flanks of other aspects. Very good stability on all recently wind scoured slopes. The snowpack generally is hard, re-frozen and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

High pressure will affect the area and a fine, dry day is expected. The strong Easterly winds will ease East-North-Easterly overnight. Freezing Level at 200m overnight rising to around 500m by the end of the day.

Our Met Forecasters promising some fine sunny weather, along with lighter wind speeds and cool air, combining to produce excellent visibility and an amazing day to be in the hills and I will look forward to it!!
