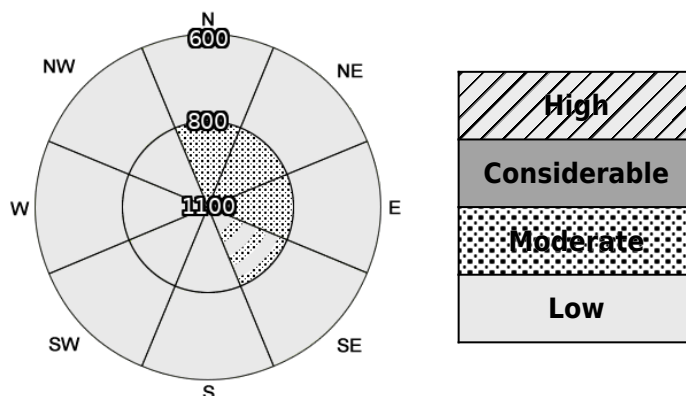
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will become re-frozen and stable. New snow instabilities will develop where fresh windslab starts to build and achieve depth in steep, sheltered North through North-East to Easterly aspects above 800 metres. Some new cornices will also begin to build in high, lee coire rims. Good stability at lower elevations and on exposed hillsides and ridges. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Rain then sleet from dawn, as the Freezing level steadily lowers overnight to bring snow to around 400-600 metres during the day. The strong overnight Southerly winds will ease a little and become more West-South-Westerly during the day.
