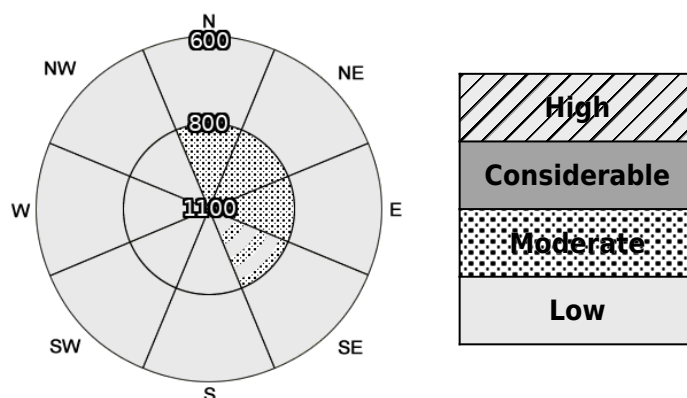
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will become re-frozen and stable. New snow instabilities will develop where fresh windslab builds and achieves depth in steep, sheltered mainly North through North-East to Easterly aspects above 800 metres. Some new cornices will also begin to develop in high, lee coire rims. Good stability at lower elevations and on exposed hillsides and ridges. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A more settled period of weather, dry overnight then sunny spells with showers falling as snow above 600 metres from mid-morning. The winds will be fresh to moderate generally South-Westerly throughout.

Comments

Poor mountain conditions on Friday; some improvement on the horizon with more settled conditions and sunny spells.
