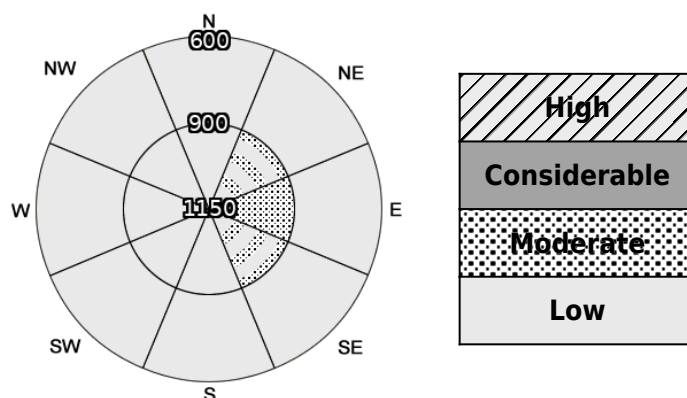


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 26/03/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack above 800 metres is mostly re-frozen and generally stable. Areas of moderately well-bonded windslab will exist above 900 metres in steep slopes and gully tops of mainly Easterly aspects. Some localised accumulations will also exist on cross-loaded steep gully flanks of other aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

A ridge of high pressure will affect the area bringing mainly dry and settled conditions; the odd snow shower above 600 metres is possible during the morning. The winds will be light West-South-Westerly, then more Southerly. Freezing level 600 metres rising to around 900 metres, by end of the day.
