

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snow pack will remain generally stable with some surface softening likely. Isolated areas of wind slab may form on very high and steep wind sheltered coire rims and gully exits on West to North-West aspects above 900 metres but will be shallow and avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Fresh South-East winds will back to strong Easterly overnight becoming fresh South-South-East later. Moderate showers are expected which will fall as snow at higher altitudes. The freezing level will hover around 850 to 1000 metres, lowering tomorrow afternoon back to around 900 metres.
