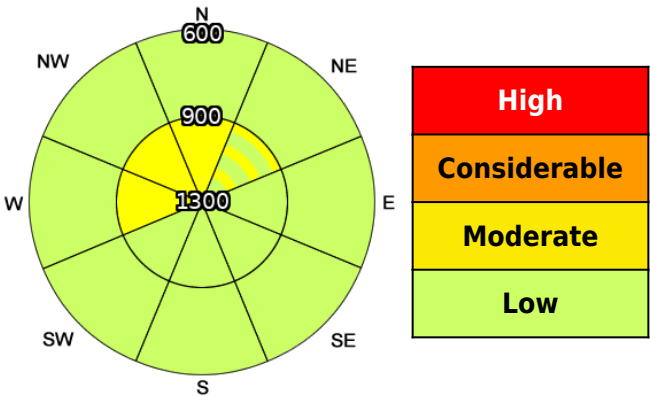
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New accumulations of unstable windslab will start to develop on Westerly to Northerly aspects mostly above 900 metres. Areas most affected will be steep wind sheltered places where accumulations gain depth, especially around corrie rims, gully exits and crag aprons. Elsewhere the snowpack will be firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be a dry evening but precipitation will start from around midnight, falling as persistent snow showers above 500 metres at first then above 800 metres. Winds will be be strong South-Soth-East to South-Easterly throughout the period.

Comments

A colder period in prospect with continuing snow above 400m or so
