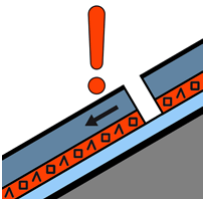

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 27/03/2018

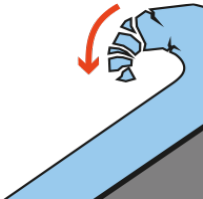

Persistent Weak Layers



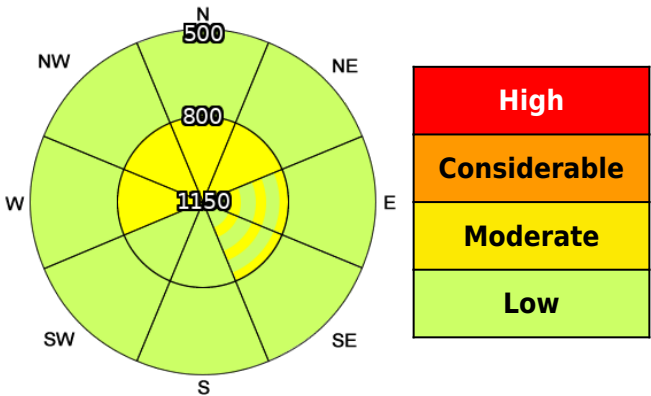

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of new moderately bonded windslab will develop on West through North to North-East aspects above 800 metres. The snowpack will become moist during the day leading to further instabilities on the above mentioned aspects. Areas most affected will be steep slopes, gully exits and coire rims. Elsewhere, localised wet snow instabilities will be present on other steep aspects. Cornices will be unstable and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Starting late tonight precipitation falling as snow above 500 metres. These snow showers will continue through the period becoming increasingly wet as the freezing level rises to near summit level or above during the the day. Overnight, strong winds will be East-South-Easterly veering during the day to the South then South-West and easing. The freezing level will drop to around 600 metres then rise during the day to above the summits.
