

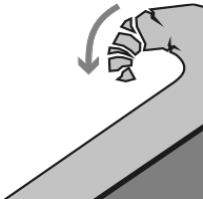

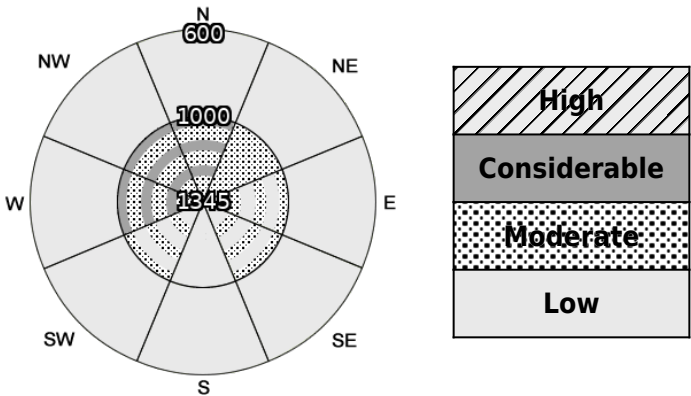
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain generally stable. Fresh snow and redistribution of the existing windslab will deposit fresh unstable windslab with greatest accumulations on West, North-West and North aspects above 1000 metres. North-East aspects will also be affected in the afternoon. Fragile cornices will form above these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong South-East winds overnight ease slightly during the day and veer Southerly in the afternoon. Showers falling as snow above 800 metres although the rain/snow limit may be higher for a time during the day. Freezing level rising to around 1000 metres during the day.

Comments

Low confidence in freezing level and snow/rain limit for tomorrow.
