

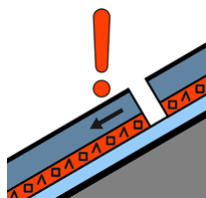

Wind Slab



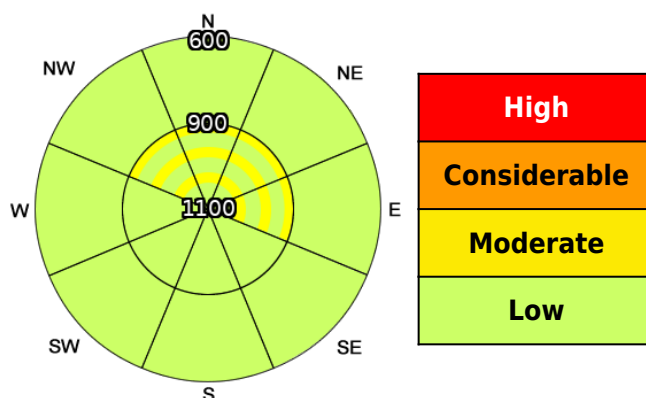
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Stability will continue to improve in most locations overnight. Localised instability will persist in thin older windslab on some very steep North-West through North to East aspects above 900m. Any new windslab development on steep West aspects will be thin, localised and confined to the top of scarp slopes above the same altitude. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry, clear and cold overnight with light winds. Winds increasing to moderate Easterly by the end of the day. A few snow showers after midday. Freezing level rising to 800m later.

Comments

Very large cornices in place above selected NE to SE aspects.
