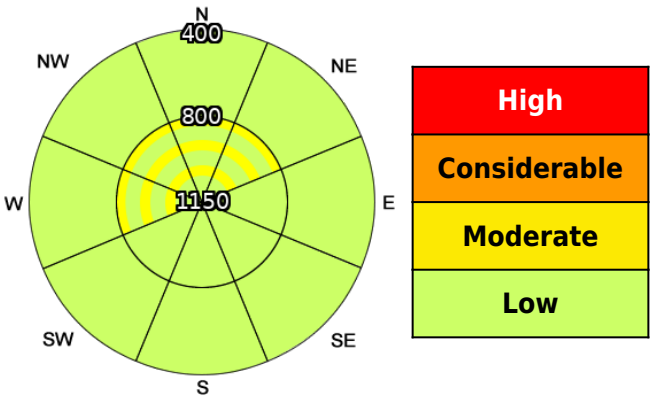
Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some re-distribution of accumulations will occur during the day with small quantities of moderately bonded windslab developing on West through North to North Easterly aspects above 900 metre. Areas most affected will be where deeper deposits build on steep slopes, gully exits and coire rims. Elsewhere the existing snowpack will be hard, re-frozen and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Mainly dry with just an isolated shower overnight and then again towards the end of the day. The winds will be light , variable initially before strengthening East-South-East becoming moderate Easterly. Feezing level will be around 500m,rising slightly as the winds strengthen towards end of the period.
