

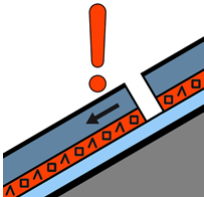

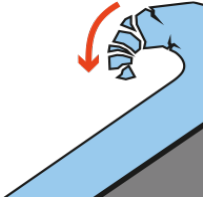

Wind Slab



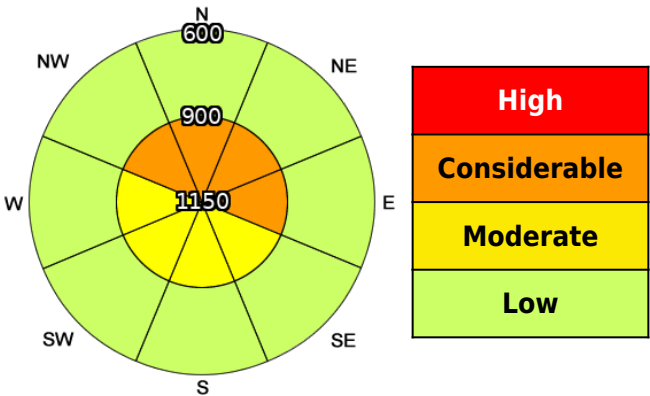

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Redistributed lying snow and new snow will continue to form unstable windslab on South through West to North-West aspects above 900m, with unstable deposits also on North and South-East aspects due to cross loading. Coire rims, scarp slopes, crag aprons and gully exits will be most affected. Unstable cornices on these aspects will continue to develop. Localised moderately unstable windslab will develop on steep sheltered terrain below 900m. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Very light snow showers above 200 metres will continue throughout the forecast period. Moderate to Strong Easterly winds will back to the North-East and ease towards the end of the day. The freezing level will be around 500 metres.
