

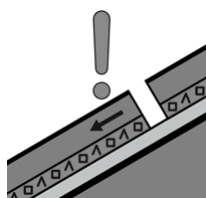

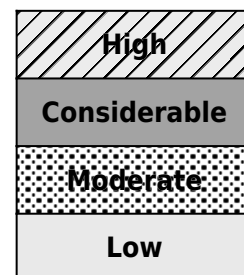
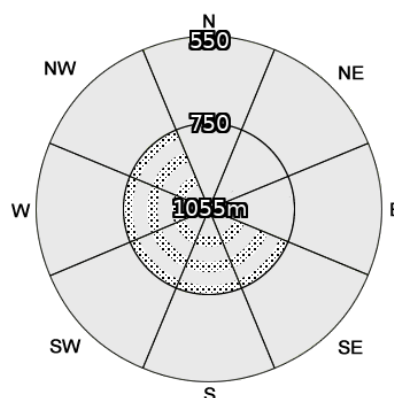
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snow pack will remain generally firm and frozen, with isolated pockets of windslab affecting wind sheltered gully tops and scarp slopes above 750 metres. At first this windslab will mainly be on high wind sheltered South-West to North-West aspects and then develop further onto South-East to South aspects later. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Fresh East winds will ease to light in strength overnight becoming generally West-North-Westerly. Some light snow showers are expected tomorrow afternoon. The freezing level will remain low and rise to 400 meters later tomorrow.

Comments

Cold in the wind on exposed ridges where the snowpack is firm and icy.
