

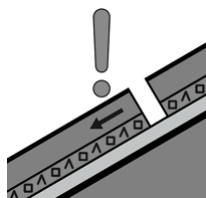

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 01/04/2018

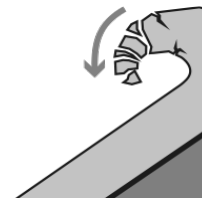
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



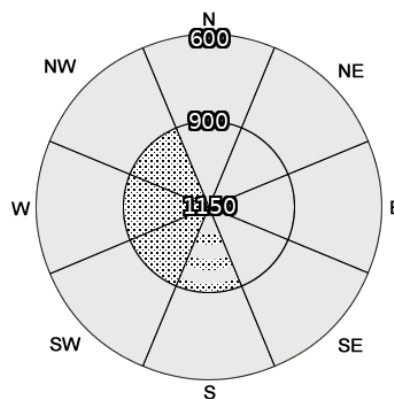
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderately bonded deposits will be present in steep wind sheltered locations mainly on South-West to North-West aspects with lesser amounts on South aspects above 900 metres. Greatest hazard will be found around corrie rims and in gully exits. Elsewhere, the snowpack will be generally well bonded and often icy where exposed to the winds. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A cold start to the day with the freezing level lifting to around 650 metres by the end of the afternoon. A dusting of snow overnight but otherwise dry. Winds will be strong overnight from the North-North-East but easing and veering throughout the day to become light from the East-South-East.

Comments

Remaining cold. Dry on Sunday but more hill snow likely on Monday.
