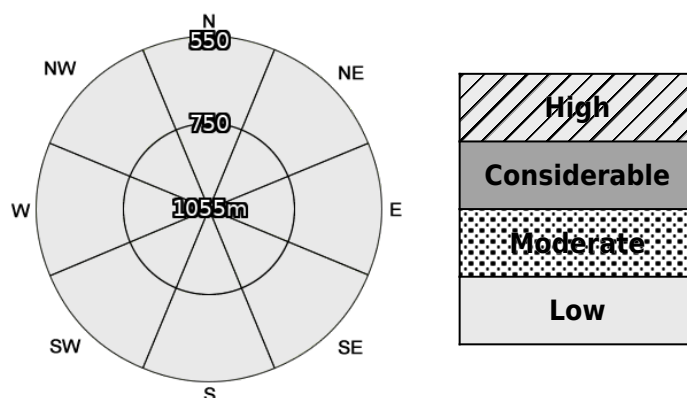


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW

Avalanche Problems

Wind Slab
Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain firm and frozen. Isolated areas of windslab will persist on high wind sheltered South-East through South-West to North-West aspects above 750 metres but these will not be extensive and will be generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.


Forecast Weather Influences

Light North winds will gradually increase in strength becoming strong Easterly by tomorrow morning. No precipitation is forecast. The freezing level will stay low fluctuating around the 400 to 450 metre level.
