

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting snow with new windslab developing on South-West to North-West aspects above 900 metres, here, avalanches are likely. Areas most affected will be around coire rims, gully tops, scarp slopes, crag aprons and steep convexities. Cornices in these areas will be unstable. Cross loading will affect South and North facing slopes. Localised windslab will develop on steep sheltered areas below 900 metres. Easterly aspects will be mostly scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers are expected overnight and during the afternoon. Steadily increasing winds through the day, moderate then strong by the afternoon. The freezing level will fluctuate at around 500 metres.

#### Comments

Wind speeds increasing through the day on Monday.
