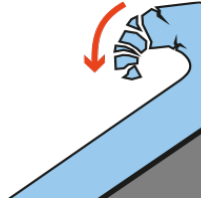

Wind Slab



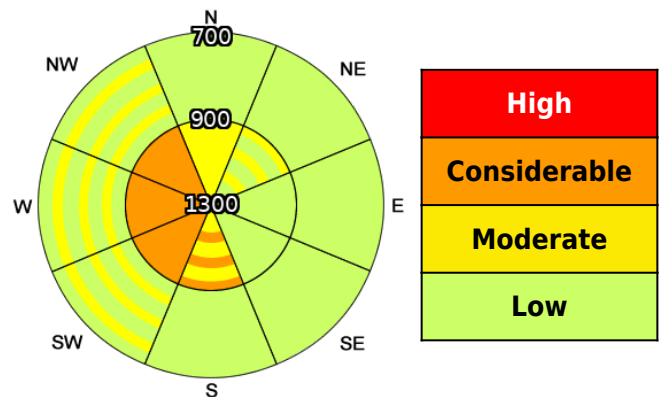

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to build on South-West to North-West aspects, mostly above 900m, here avalanches are likely, coire rims, gully tops, crag aprons and steep convexities most affected. New accumulations building on Southerly aspects later. Large collapse prone cornices also threaten here. Localised windslab will develop on steep wind sheltered areas below 900m. North to Easterly aspects will be scoured and stability will generally be good. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Heavy and persistent snowfall is expected throughout the forecast period, mostly above 400 metres. Winds will be moderate strength East-North-Easterly overnight backing North-East then strong Northerly by the end of the forecast period. Freezing level around 500 metres.

#### Comments

Winter definitely continues, with heavy snow forecast for Wednesday.
