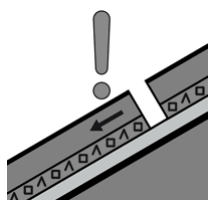


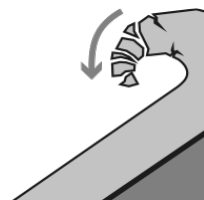

Avalanche Problems



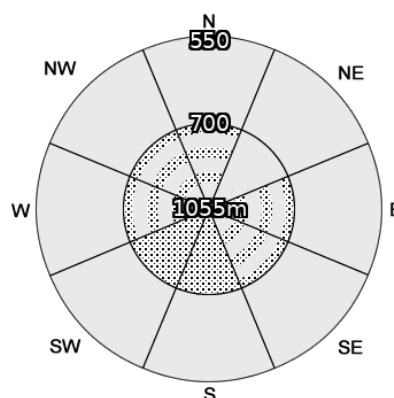
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of moderately well bonded windslab will persist on South-East through South to West aspects mainly above 700 metres and notably where it gains depth and extent in steep locations lying on the old firm snowpack. East and North-West to North aspects are affected due to previous cross-loading. The old and firm snowpack remains well bonded and stable. Unstable cornices remain. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

After a cold and clear night with a ground frost possible in the glens, a few light snow showers arrive by daybreak, easing through the morning and clearing later with bright spells and some sunny intervals. Remaining cold with the freezing level peaking around 600 metres in the afternoon. Fresh North winds will back generally West and ease through the day, becoming light.

Comments

The mountains remain very wintry. Milder conditions feeding in leading up to the weekend.
