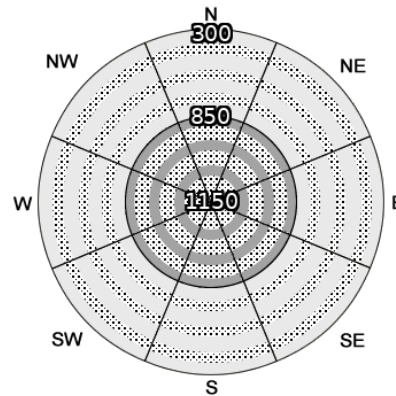

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further accumulations of poorly bonded soft windslab will continue to develop and build on all wind sheltered aspects mainly above 850 metres. Wind sheltered, steep locations, below ridge crests, coire rims and gully exits will be most affected. Localised windslab deposits may also develop on steep wind sheltered locations below 850 metres. Large fragile cornices will exist above many slope aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Mainly clear, cold and dry overnight followed by further light snow showers through the day. During the night the moderate Northerly winds will continuing backing becoming West-South-West during the day and easing. The wet bulb freezing level will slowly rise to around 600 metres.

Comments

Deep unconsolidated new snow exists on many aspects makes walking progress slow at higher elevations.
