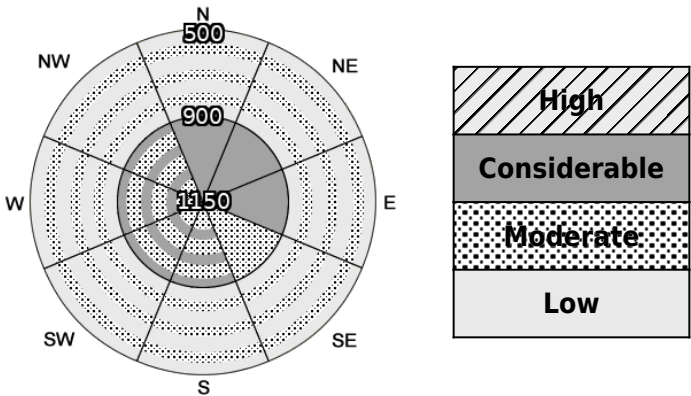

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A slow thaw is forecast. Unstable windslab exists on many aspects above 900 metres. The stability of these deposits will decrease during the afternoon and evening as the freezing level rises and rain affects the snowpack. Wet snow instabilities will develop in many steep locations with ridge crests, coire rims and gully exits most affected. Lower elevations affected more rapidly by the thaw. Cornices will be unstable affecting the slopes below. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight followed by isolated snow showers in the early part of the morning. The freezing level will slowly rise above the summits with some sleet and rain. The winds will start to increase during the night becoming strong through the day from a South-Easterly direction.

Comments

Freezing level around 1200-1400 metres.
