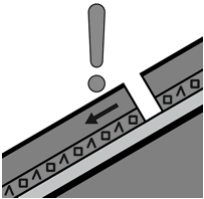


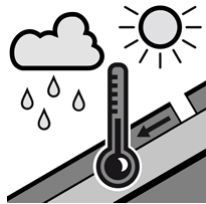

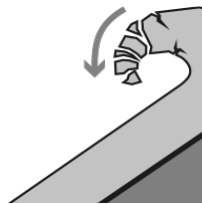

Persistent Weak Layers



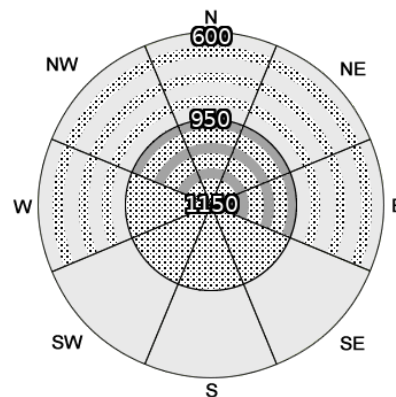

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Little change is expected to the snowpack but slow consolidation will continue. Poorly bonded windslab will persist with the greatest accumulations on North-West through North to East aspects mainly above 950 metres. Other aspects may have localised windslab instabilities and cornices will be prone to collapse. At lower elevations the snowpack will continue to thaw with wet snow instabilities developing on steeper aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

The freezing level will rise above the summits this evening and remain so through the period. Isolated light shower risk but generally dry. South-Easterly winds will veer becoming West-South-West and decreasing.

**Comments**

Mild condition through Saturday and Sunday freezing levels around 1200 - 1400 metres. Light winds over the weekend.
