




#### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 09/04/2018


##### Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers




Wet Snow

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

In general the snowpack will continue to thaw and consolidate in all areas. Instabilities will persist in areas of steep and convex terrain. Westerly to Northerly facing slopes above 1000 meters will be mostly affected. Large unstable cornices overhang many aspects, especially West through North to Easterly. These will be collapse prone, and could potentially trigger slopes below. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Mostly dry with the potential for some light sleet during the afternoon. Light South-Westerly winds will back South-South-Easterly and increase to moderate. Continuing mild, freezing at around summit levels overnight before rising to 1400 metres during the day.

##### Comments

Cornice collapse and rock fall are a continuing hazard.
