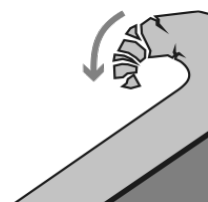


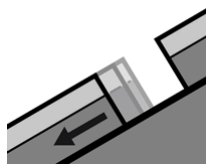

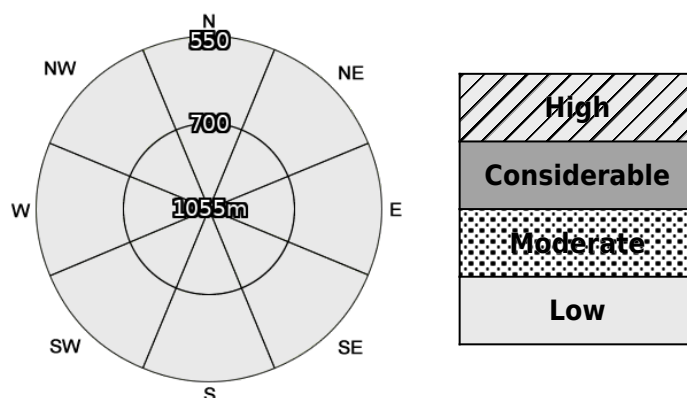

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The slowly thawing snowpack will be well consolidated and stable throughout. It will remain generally firm with some surface softening particularly at lower levels where it is very patchy in distribution. Some large cornices will be unstable and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will be a fine mild and dry day, partly cloudy with bright and sunny spells. Due to a temperature inversion overnight, some summit sleet and snow is expected but fresh snow deposits will thaw during the day. The strong Easterly airflow will moderate by daybreak and the freezing level will be well above the summits.

**Comments**

With an Easterly airflow persisting, the weather will be generally good in the west.
