

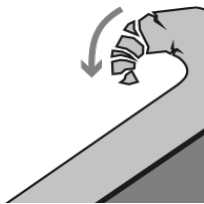

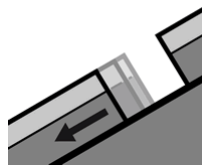

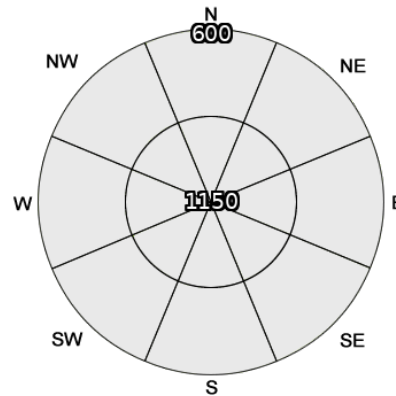

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to slowly thaw and consolidate stability will generally be good on all aspects. Patchy wet, soft snow cover at lower elevations, but reasonable cover remains above 650 metres. Some wet snow surface instabilities are likely on steeper slopes. Unstable, large cornices remain, mainly above North-West to East aspects, these are very prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry with clear spells this evening and overnight. The dry conditions continuing through the morning then some light rain or drizzle in the afternoon. The winds will back becoming East-South-Easterly and strengthening. The freezing level remaining above the summits.
