






Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected. The slowly thawing and diminishing spring snowpack will be well consolidated and stable throughout. Becoming patchy at all levels, very patchy at lower elevations. The snowpack will soften through the day at lower levels and on sun exposed areas, but remain firmer at height. Unstable cornices will remain and glide cracks will become more apparent. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be a largely dry and warm day with patchy cloud and good sunny spells, but increasing amounts of cloud in the afternoon. The light Southerly wind will back East overnight, becoming fresh to strong over the tops through the day. Freezing level will remain well above the summits.
