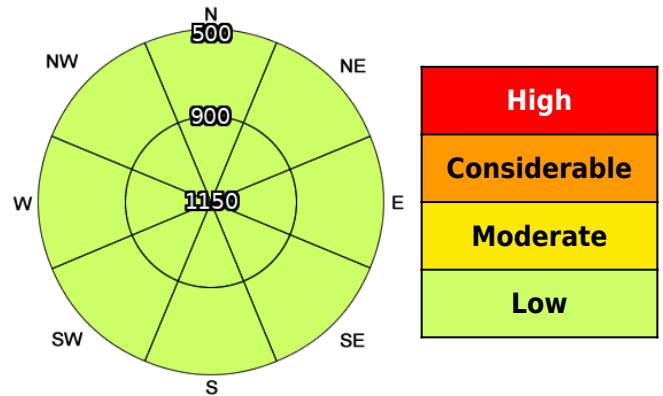
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Isolated shallow accumulations of windslab will develop during Saturday night and Sunday morning mostly on steep sheltered North-West through North to North-East aspects mainly above 900 metres. These accumulations are not expected to be extensive and should be avoidable. Milder conditions with a mixture of rain will lead to partial consolidation in these accumulations. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, snow showers becoming heavy at times. Drier, clearer conditions will follow from the West during the night. Severe gale South-Easterly winds veering South-Westerly then Southerly and easing a little by morning. Sunday will be a drier and brighter day with scattered showers, wintry above 700 metres. The freezing level will rise to around 950 metres.
