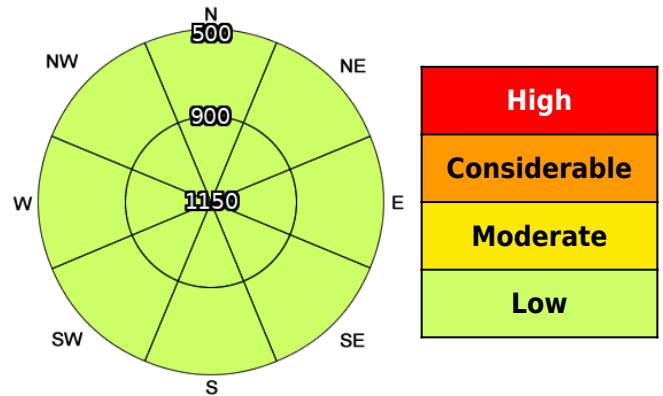
Avalanche Problems



Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight, the moist snowpack will consolidate further, any new snow amounts are not expected to be significant. The freezing level will rise above the summits during the afternoon depleting and reducing snow cover and moistening the snowpack. The snowpack will remain generally well bonded and stable on all aspects and elevations. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Mostly dry conditions overnight and during the day on Monday. The freezing level will be around 800 metres, Southerly winds will decrease overnight and for the first part of Monday. Late afternoon, rain with light snow above 900 metres during the evening. Southerly winds will also strengthen with severe gales developing on higher ridges with storm force winds over the summits.

Comments

Rain spreading in late afternoon with strong wind leading to thaw conditions.
