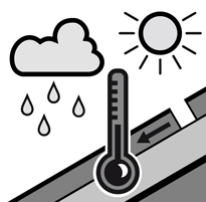
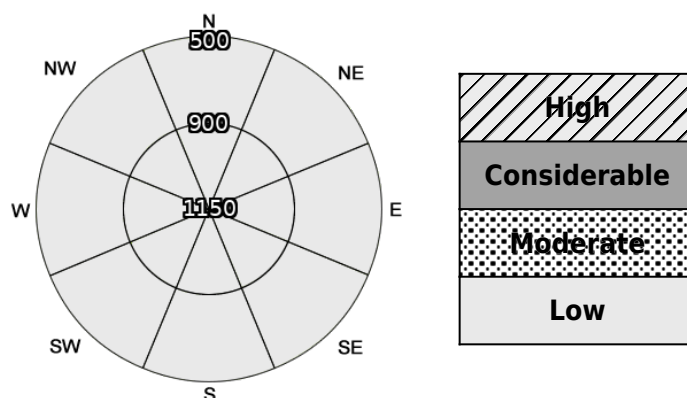


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 18/12/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wet Snow****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Rain will saturate the snowpack leading to wet snow instabilities particularly on steep slopes with a North-West through to North-East aspects. Later in the afternoon a dusting of new snow over the summits, accumulations are not expected to be extensive. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, the freezing level will rise to well above the summits then lower to around 1000 metres later in the afternoon. Heavy and persistent rain will accompany this rise in freezing levels. Southerly winds will be severe gale force with some storm force gusts over the summits.

Comments

A front crossing Scotland on Tuesday will bring a 12 hour period of rain starting early hours Tuesday until mid afternoon! The outlook: Wednesday will be a quieter day with a few showers, freezing level will be around 800 metres but no real snow accumulations are expected.
