
Avalanche Problems



Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight the snowpack will become saturated. Wet snow instabilities are expected in the windslab deposits which exist in sheltered North to East aspects above 900 metres. However, due to the general limited snow cover, these instabilities are not expected to be extensive with the tops of sheltered gullies being most affected. Stability will improve during the afternoon. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A mild and stormy period of weather is expected. Overnight and during the morning the freezing level will be above the summits, and rain will fall at all levels. Through the afternoon the freezing level will drop to around summit level and rain will begin to turn to wet snow and will ease. Strong winds will be from the South.

Comments

A mild wet day expected on Tuesday. More wintery weather expected to return to higher tops later in the week.
