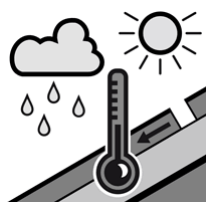

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 18/12/2018

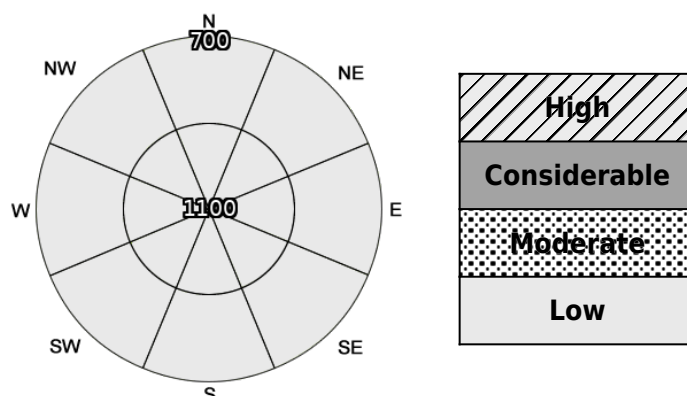
Avalanche Problems



Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight and during the morning the snowpack will become wet, and the near surface layers saturated. Wet snow instabilities will be present in the windslab deposits that lie mainly on North to East aspects above 900 metres; also on North-West aspects. Gullies and around coire rims will be most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to be a mild day with very strong South-South-East winds. Overnight it will rain at all levels and rainfall will increase in intensity during the morning. During the afternoon the freezing level will drop to around the summits, precipitation will ease and start to turn to sleet and wet snow, and winds will lighten and become Southerly.
