

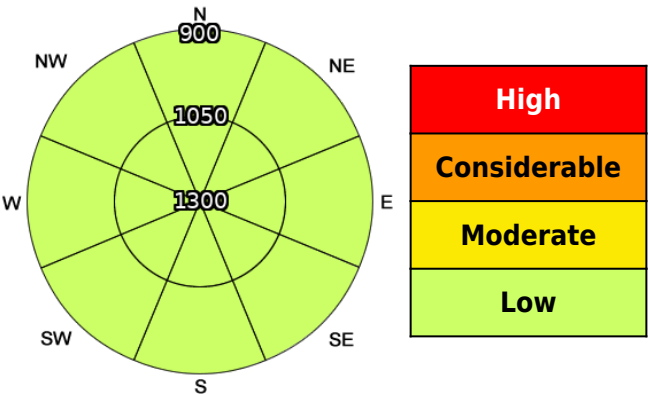

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 29/12/2018

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to diminish and consolidate in all areas. Greatest depth will remain on North-West to Northerly aspects above 950 metres. Although soft and moist the snowpack will be generally stable. Some new wet snow may accumulate on Northerly aspects above 1100 metres but this will be generally shallow and insignificant. Many other areas will be bare of snow. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Rain during the night will turn to sleet over the summits, this will clear to leave a dry day. Moderate South-Westerly winds will increase to strong veer to the West-North-West, and ease through the afternoon. A little cooler during the day, as the freezing level falls to summit levels.

Comments

Rock and ice fall from the buttresses will continue to be a significant hazard during the thaw conditions, easier gully lines becoming broken.
