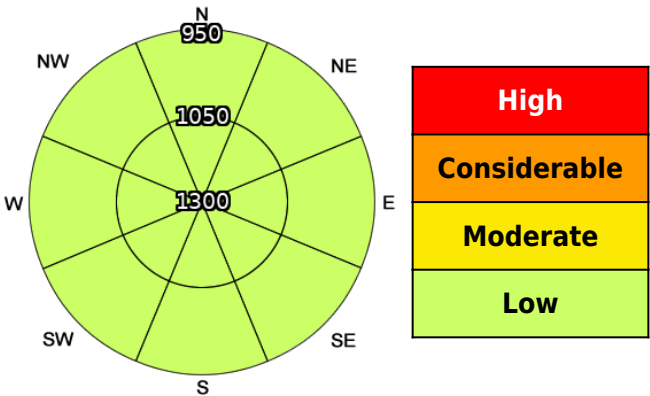
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The sparse old snowpack will be firm and stable with greatest amounts on North-West to Northerly facing slopes above 1000 metres. Isolated pockets of windslab will develop through the afternoon on sheltered North-East to South-East aspects above 950 metres. These will be generally shallow and avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light Southerly winds will veer South-Westerly and increase strong to gale force through the night with drizzle at all levels. Through the day strong to gale force winds will continue and veer to the West with some light snow showers through the afternoon. The freezing level will fall to 900 metres.
