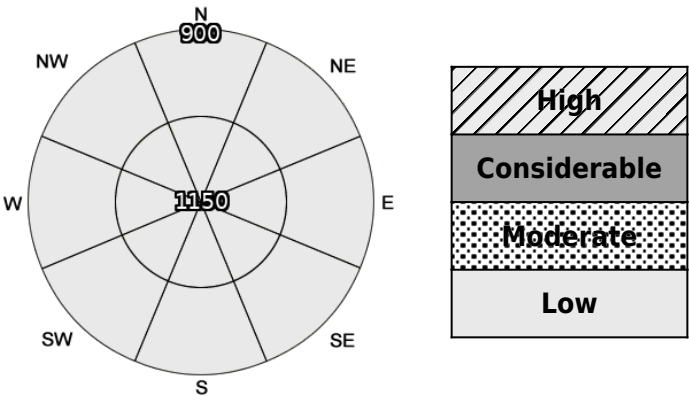
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack which mainly exists as patches in the higher Northern and Easterly facing corries and gullies will generally remain stable. Isolated areas of windslab will exist in the most sheltered areas on steeper old snow but these should generally be avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be very light snowfall in the earlier part of the night mainly above 800 metres, becoming mainly dry later. Strong overnight winds will ease giving a fresh North-Westerly airflow through the course of the day. The freezing level will be in the region of 750 metres.

Comments

Trace amounts of snow overnight then dry. Surface of old snow will become firm and icy in places.
