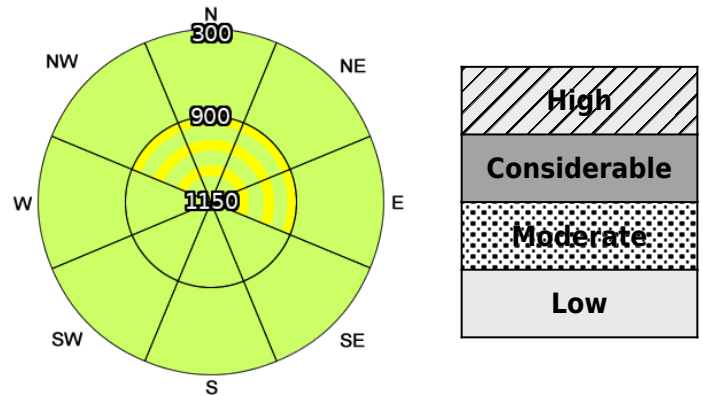
Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack is mainly to be found in the higher Northern and Easterly facing corries and gullies and is generally patchy in nature. Cool conditions will maintain a firm surface on much of the snowpack and stability will remain good. Light falls of new snow later will form shallow pockets of windslab but these will generally be avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be mainly dry and cool for much of the period. Winds will be moderate to fresh through the day. Towards the end of the day some light snow showers will affect the highest slopes.

Comments

Firm icy surface will exist on much of the remaining snowpack. New snow amounts will be very small.
