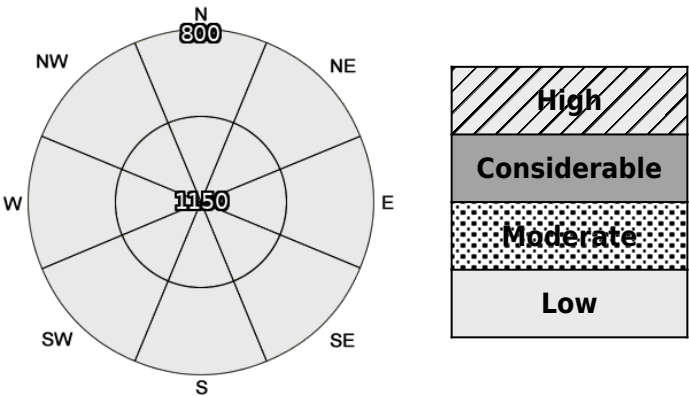
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New windslab will develop mainly on North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres but accumulations are not expected to be significant. Other slope aspects there will be a light cover of fresh snow. The patchy older snowpack will refreeze and remain generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, with the freezing level well above the summits heavy rain is expected at all levels accompanied by strong Westerly winds. Gradually becoming colder during the day, freezing level lowering to around 800 metres with wintry showers falling as snow above 700 metres. Winds will remain strong from the West-North-West.

Comments

Unsettled moist weather, staying cool till Monday afternoon then another mild spell arriving.
