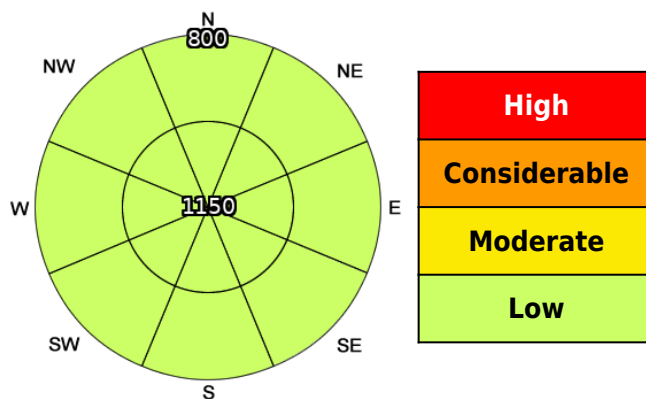
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh light snow deposits are expected above 800 metres; these are expected to be shallow and generally stable. Thin accumulations of windslab may start to develop in sheltered locations mostly on North-East to South-East aspects above 950 metres these are not expected to be extensive and easily avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, freezing level at around 900 metres, light snow showers above 800 metres with strong Northerly winds. The winds will ease during the day becoming South-Westerly then slowly strengthening in the afternoon with further light snow showers mainly above 900 metres. During the course of the day the freezing level rising to around 1100 metres.

Comments

Monday rain showers preceded by snow above 1000 metres but freezing levels rising above all summits later on Monday evening. Rain will become persistent and heavy at times through much of Tuesday.
