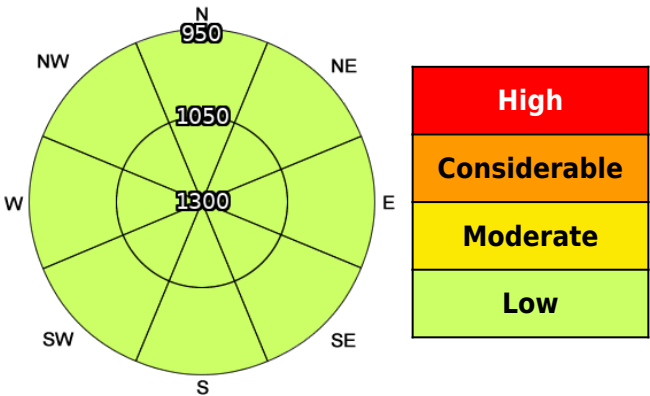
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New windslab will develop on Easterly to Southerly aspects mainly above 800 metres. Some deeper pockets may develop in these areas; however, new accumulations will be generally localised and overlie bare ground. Elsewhere the old snowpack will be firm and stable. Greatest amounts are on North-West to North-East aspects above 1000 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Cold overnight with snow showers mostly above 400 metres on moderate to strong North-North-Westerly winds. Snow showers will clear to leave a dry day, winds will back to the West-South-West and the freezing level will rise to 800 metres by the end of the day.
