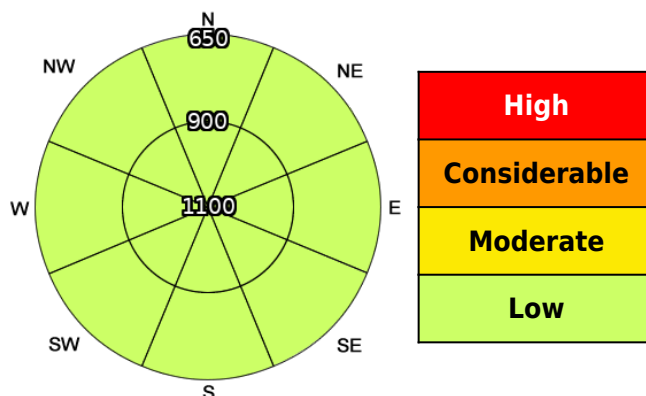
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some windslab accumulations may begin to develop on steep mainly Easterly aspects. Accumulations are expected to be thin, limited in extent and confined to very sheltered locations above 900 metres. The generally cosmetic cover of fresh snow at lower elevations will begin to thaw again by the end of the day, as Freezing level rises to around summits. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain cool overnight with some further snow showers. The Freezing level will lower to around 400 metres before rising again to around summits by the end of the day. The cool North-Westerly winds will ease and back West becoming West-South-Westerly and strong again by the end of the period.
