

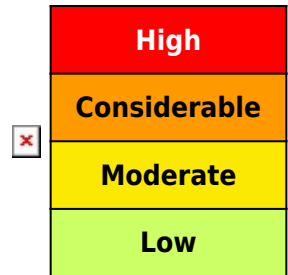

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 18/01/2019

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected in the snowpack. There will be a shallow covering of snow above 500 metres. Some shallow and isolated patches of windslab will exist in sheltered locations at higher levels. However, these will be easily avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be cloudy but mainly dry. The freezing level will be around 300 metres. Moderate winds will be from the South-East.

Comments

Remaining cool for the next few days. Not a great deal of snow in Glen Coe, but at least the hills look quite wintry.
