
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of unstable windslab will persist mainly in gullies, hollows and around corrie rims on North-West through North to East aspects above 900 metres. During the afternoon fresh unstable windslab will be deposited with greatest accumulations on North-West to North-east aspects above 900 metres. Fragile cornices will develop above these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate North-West winds will soon back Southerly and then slowly increase to become strong during the day. Mainly dry until the afternoon when there will be showers falling as snow above around 400 metres. The freezing level will be around 550 metres.

Comments

The outlook is for generally cold conditions although a warmer few days at the end of the week look likely.
