

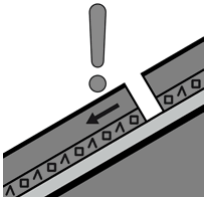

Avalanche Problems



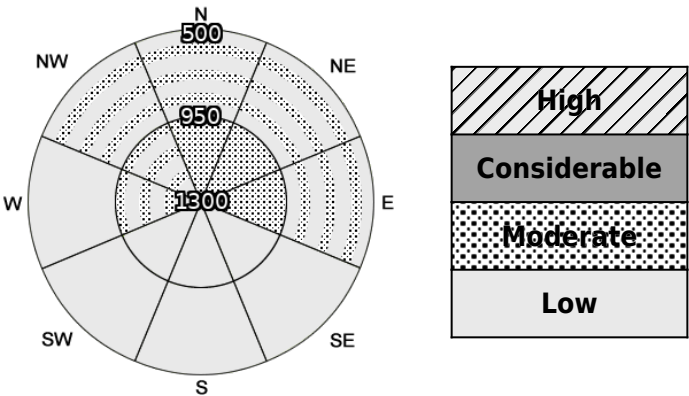
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities will remain in the snowpack especially in the deeper windslab accumulations that have formed in wind sheltered locations on mostly North to North-Easterly aspects above 950 metres. Accumulations are limited in extent but are located around Corrie rims, gully exits and scarp slopes. Below this level, accumulations of moderate to weakly bonded windslab will be present in wind sheltered hollows and banks. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall will continue into Monday evening, then showers which will die out during the night with a dry day expected. Southerly winds decreasing in strength during the evening becoming light Westerly during the day. Remaining cold with the freezing level dropping to 200 metres or so.
