

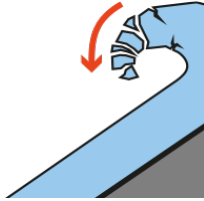

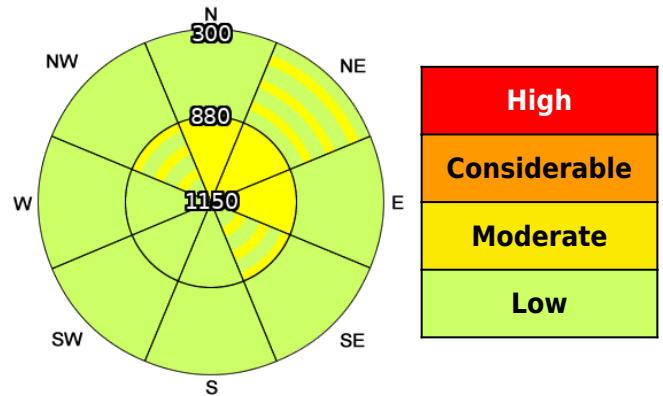
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Windslab instabilities will persist particularly in the deeper snowpack accumulations. The greatest deposits are in sheltered locations mostly on North-West through North to South-Easterly aspects above 880 metres. Tops of gullies and steep corrie headwalls will be particularly affected with cornices, soft and fragile. Other aspects have isolated windslab deposits and new snow instabilities on steeper slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining cold, freezing at most levels. Some light overnight snow showers followed by a predominantly dry day, light snow showers are again possible late afternoon. Winds will be moderate in strength from a South-Westerly direction.

Comments

Remaining cold and generally dry for next couple of days.
