




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will continue to consolidate and stability will be generally good. Localised areas of fresh unstable windslab will develop during the day with greatest accumulations on North to East aspects above 1000 metres with gullies and corrie rims most affected. Fragile cornices will form above these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate to strong South-West winds. Showers throughout, initially falling as snow on the summits, then as rain to all levels during the night, with snow again at summit level in the morning and to lower levels the afternoon. Freezing level above the summits overnight dropping to around 1000 metres by the end of the afternoon.

Comments

Winter conditions should return on Sunday.
