

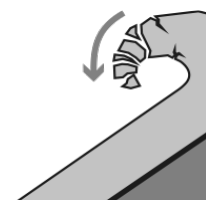

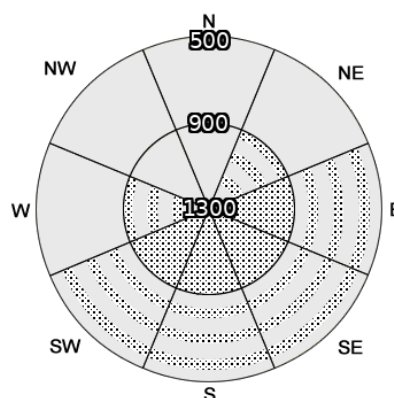
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab accumulations will continue to develop on North-East through South to South-Westerly aspects. Greatest instability will be in steep terrain above 900 metres especially around corrie rims, gully tops and crag aprons. Moderately bonded windslab will be present on steep banks between 900 and 500 metres. On these aspects cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers above 200 metres will become increasingly scattered during the night before dying out on Monday morning. Strong North-North-Westerly winds easing to moderate during the day and backing to the West then West-South-West. The freezing level will fall to 300 metres.
