

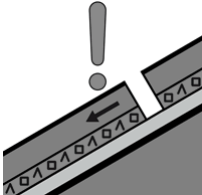

Avalanche Problems



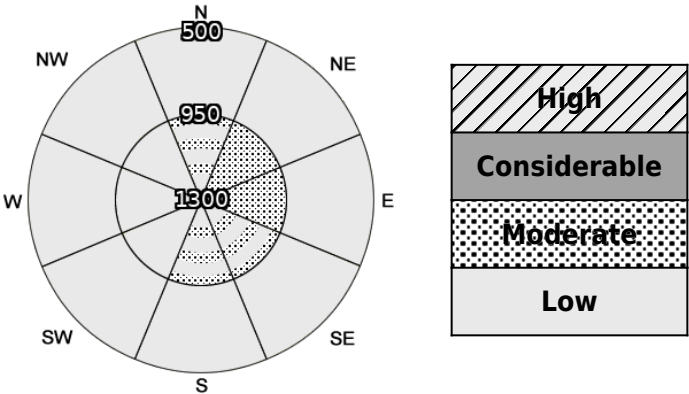
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some drifting during the first part of the night. Unstable windslab will be present on North through East to South-East aspects mainly above 950 metres. Greatest instabilities will be in steep and convex areas, also around corrie rims and at the tops of gullies. Localised instabilities will persist within the old storm slab on steep convex Southerly aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very cold dry conditions throughout with sunshine during the day. Moderate South-West winds will ease during the night and gradually back through South and to the East by mid afternoon. The average freezing level will be at 400 metres.

Comments

Continuing to be cold for the next few days. A sunny day in prospect again on Thursday.
