

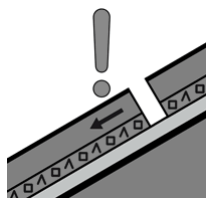

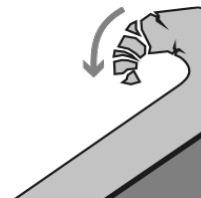
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



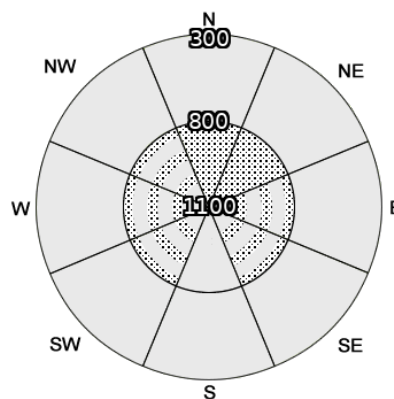
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities will persist with the cold temperatures. Areas affected will primarily be high on steep North to East coire backwalls and gully exits above 800 metres. During the day there will be some re-deposited of snow in high sheltered lee locations of many aspects, with localised areas of soft windslab developing. Any new cornices are fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain dry and cold throughout. Winds will be variable, moderate, South-West overnight, backing light South, South East, East then North-Easterly by the end of the day. Cold temperatures, with freezing at all levels

Crags plastered with new snow, although build up still remains thin in main Post Face gullies - improving!
