




Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities will persist in the snowpack, especially in the soft windslab present mainly on North to East aspects above 800 metres. North-West and South-East aspects will also be affected. Gullies, coire rims and scarp slopes will be most affected. Fragile cornices will be present above these aspects. During the day redistribution of snow may form soft windslab in high sheltered locations on South-West to North-West aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to remain cold and dry throughout the period, with light Southerly backing Easterly winds.
