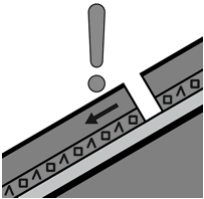


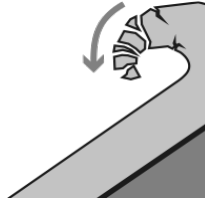

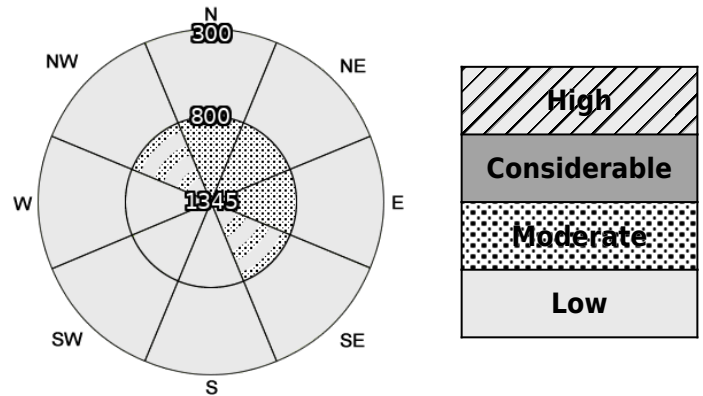
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderately to weakly bonded windslab will persist, mainly on North to East aspects above 800 metres, though North-West and South-East aspects will also be affected. Deeper accumulations will be generally fairly localised; gullies, coire rims, crag aprons and scarp slopes will be most affected. Fragile cornices will be present mainly above North to South-East aspects. Redistribution of snow during the period may deposit some soft windslab onto other aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain cold and dry throughout the period. Winds are expected to be light, East-North-Easterly overnight and during the morning, North-North-Westerly from midday.
