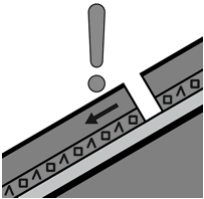


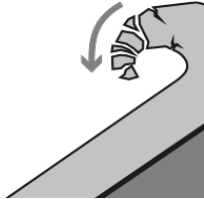

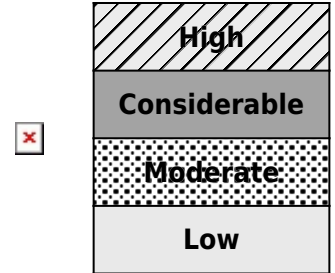
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The older snowpack where exposed will be firm and icy. Recent snow lying at all levels will remain generally soft and unconsolidated but will generally be stable. Deeper drifts and areas of moderately bonded soft windslab will exist in sheltered areas such as summit gullies and on slopes with a North through to Easterly aspect mainly above 900 metres, gully exits and corrie headwalls will be particularly affected. Cornices will remain fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain cold with the freezing level around 250 metres. It will be mainly dry other than the odd snow shower overnight. Winds overnight will be Northerly strong backing South-Westerly becoming fresh through the course of the day. Generally clear and sunny conditions can be expected.
